

# Kew the Question

## Learning outcomes

- Describe the importance to humans of eating the right amount and type of food
- Listen to and respond to information and questions
- Write their ideas and share these ideas with their peers and teacher
- Demonstrate skills in public speaking

## Timings

Completing the introduction activities will take around 30 minutes. The challenge itself will require around 2 hours to complete, but you may wish to spend more or less time on it.

## Resources

All resources and supporting information can be found in the “Resources” tab of the Endeavour platform, unless specified.

## The challenge

Pupils will need to write and read out an answer to the question:  
**What can you do to end hunger around the world?**

To complete this challenge, they will need to:

- Find out about different ways we can achieve this goal
- Decide what the two most important things that they can do are
- Tell a partner what they are going to write.
- Write their two most important things to answer the question: What can you do to end hunger around the world?
- Share their writing with the rest of the class (or a partner) by reading it out.

## Introduction – Watch and learn

Introduce the challenge to your class by playing the short clip on the “Getting started” tab.

Play the Kew the question ‘Watch and learn’ video with your class. Pause at questions for pupils to discuss and feedback. After the video, complete the introduction discussion card activity.



# Kew the Question

## Introduction – Discussion cards

This activity invites pupils to discuss causes of global hunger. This activity can be done in groups by printing a set of cards in colour or grayscale. We recommend 3-6 pupils and one card or set of cards per group. Once each group has completed the activity, they can feed back to the rest of the class.

As a whole class approach, display the cards on the whiteboard.

## Completing the challenge

Pupils can complete the challenge alone or in groups. They can work on the challenge in class, or as a homework activity. The “Useful links” can be used as research or for inspiration.

You can upload your pupils' challenge-related work to the Endeavour platform.

## Success Criteria

You will need to submit a video recording of the winning presentation answering the question: **What can you do to end hunger around the world?**

### The entry should:

Be no longer than three minutes

Clearly answer the question: **“What can you do to end hunger around the world?”**

Identify two things they could do to end hunger around the world

### The entry will be judged on:

- Content: Do they have two different things that they could do to help end hunger across the world? Have they answered the question?
- Style: Speaking clearly and persuading the audience, including using their voice with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear.

## Judging the challenge

Only one entry can be submitted per school so you may wish to hold a judging panel at school to determine which entry will represent your school in the competition. You can use the success criteria as a way for your pupils to self and peer assess their work.

In the “Additional resources” page you will find downloadable certificate templates to fill in and award to pupils or classes who have completed Endeavour challenges.
