The Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees at Bentham-Moxon Trust consists of no fewer than three and not more than six people. The Trustees oversee the management of the Trust and are responsible for ensuring its long-term financial stability. They meet twice a year in June and November, the latter meeting being used to review grant applications and make the grant awards that further the work of Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew. The Trustees serve on a part-time basis with the day-to-day management of the Trust delegated to the Secretary/Treasurer.

Dr Isabel Larridon, Chair

Isabel is the Priority Leader Accelerated Taxonomy at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew where she is responsible for achieving the Initiatives set out in Kew's Science Strategy on Documenting Biodiversity, building the Tree of Life, Innovating Species Identification and identifying Tropical Important Plant Areas. As Priority Leader, she also supports the organisation of the MSc in Plant and Fungal Taxonomy, Diversity and Conservation organised by RBG Kew and Queen Mary University of London. Her research focuses on the evolution, biodiversity and conservation of African and Madagascan plants with particular emphasis on the Cyperaceae or sedge family. She regularly publishes in specialist journals and leads research programmes on plant and fungal taxonomy in Madagascar, and on the Cyperaceae and Compositae families. She contributes to the scientific community as founder of the International Sedge Society, and as a member of the IUCN-SSC Freshwater Plant Specialist Group and the West Africa Plant Red List Authority. Isabel also serves as a Council Member and Vice-President of The Linnean Society, and carries out editorial duties for the scientific journals Kew Bulletin and Plant Ecology and Evolution.
